<u>Solar Eclipse Glasses</u>

Here's where you'll be able to find eclipse glasses in central Ohio:

*Not all of the listed glasses are free. View each website to determine possible costs.

The Columbus Metropolitan Library is handing out free glasses at all 23 of its libraries starting March 18.

COSI kits (minimum purchase is a pack of 30 glasses); COSI will also be handing out thousands

of free glasses at their eclipse viewing event. The American Astronomical Society has curated a list of reputable vendors of solar filters and glasses that you can view here.

Ohio History Connection is hosting a viewing party at the John & Annie Glenn Museum in New Concord. Free eclipse glasses will be distributed to those attending.

Those staying at a Dublin hotel during the solar eclipse will receive a free pair of glasses and access to a VIP viewing event. Learn more about the deal here.

Many local libraries are distributing free solar eclipse glasses, including Worthington, Westerville and Columbus. You can find your local library by zip code here.

A solar eclipse happens when the moon passes between the sun and the Earth. Sometimes the moon only blocks part of the sun's light. This results in a partial solar eclipse. When the moon blocks all of the sun, that's called a total solar eclipse.

When the moon blocks the sun's light, it casts a shadow on part of the Earth.
